Greetings Members!

We are excited to announce that Mr. Shawn Wells, Chief Security Strategist of Red Hat will be our special guest speaker.

As the Chief Security Strategist for Red Hat's North American Public Sector organization, Shawn has worked to stimulate innovation against U.S. Intelligence and Military information assurance challenges. His recent projects have included collaborating with NSA's Information Assurance Directorate and DISA on security automation for DoD STIG; open sourcing DoD Cyber curriculum with the Army Cyber School; working with the DoD Centralized Super Computing Facility to create cross domain supercomputers for SIGINT and MASINT processing; and co-authoring the OpenStack Security Guide, published by the OpenStack Foundation. Formerly an NSA civilian, Shawn was the senior developer of the Al-Qaeda Senior Leadership SIGINT DB (AQLSDB), which ingested, exploited, and analyzed High Power Cell Phone (HPCP) collections under S3. His academic work includes Data Science at Harvard, technical strategy and innovation at MIT Sloan, nuclear energy at Stanford, and he is a graduate of Carnegie Mellon's CIO University.



### Hybrid Cloud Management & Security

On June 8, 2017, M. Coby Holloway, a Vice President for SAIC and a leading provider of information technology solutions presented a keynote address to the members and guests of the AFCEA Fort Knox Gold Vault Chapter. The audience leaned forward as Mr. Holloway spoke about Hybrid Cloud Management & Security. His presentation covered cloud computing service models, deployment models, and essential characteristics. He informed the audience that many organizations are moving toward hybrid deployment models which allow a combination of deployment types to facilitate portability and “cloud bursting.” He then described considerations for developing and using Hybrid Clouds and concluded on the importance of having the right tools and knowledge to manage hybrid environments.

was held at the Saber & Quill in Fort Knox, Ky. These events offer attendees the opportunity to network with fellow professionals and keep their eye on emerging technologies and information which can be used to help them improve their own organization.

# July Young AFCEAN Event Highlights

## Successful Leadership depends on Sound Financial Planning

Have you ever had more month at the end of your paycheck? Have you raided your emergency fund for a want instead of a need? These situations have happened to all of us and will likely happen again unless we learn some new strategies. To help us with this, Mike Petrosky of Waddell & Reed gave a financial strategy presentation during our July 20<sup>th</sup> Young AFCEAN Lunch & Learn Event. Mr. Petrosky described the monthly cycle of finances as well as the financial cycle in the human lifespan, highlighting pitfalls to be aware of, considerations

to make, and strategies that can be adopted for success.

Our successful leadership depends on sound financial planning and so it was compelling to learn of hidden or unexpected pitfalls and alternatives that we can employ to avoid pain and maintain happiness. An important focus of this presentation was learning to plan for the unexpected. To this end, Petrosky suggested that families should identify their annual and quarterly goals and assess their financial health. On a monthly basis he suggested setting a once or twice per month date to pay the regular recurring monthly expenses. A useful strategy he provided was to have all income deposited to the family savings account and then to have 2 checking accounts; one account for the regularly recurring expenses and one account for the amount of money the family anticipated they would need to spend for variable expenses during the time period. This strategy ensures that any extra money stays in the savings account.

Another important strategy Mr. Petrosky suggested was to have your emergency fund in a separate local bank. Here the goal is to

keep the fund out of sight and out of mind until it is absolutely needed and then to require one's self to physically travel to the location to withdraw the funds that are needed. This helps to ensure that withdrawals are made only in the event of an emergency need and not a spur of the moment desire.

This presentation included several other useful topics including understanding the turbulence of financial markets, and retirement and legacy planning. Again, all useful topics that we all need to consider sooner rather than later to protect our family and community. Following the event, Mr. Petrosky answered a variety of questions and made himself available to our members for consultation.

# UNIVERSITY OF THE CUMBERLANDS

The University of the Cumberland (UC) is pleased to announce that the School of Computer and Information Sciences has been approved to offer three new advanced degrees by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC).

The new degree offerings include a Master of Science in Digital Forensics (MSDF), a Master of Science in Information Technology (MSIT), and a Doctorate of Philosophy in Information Technology (Ph.D. IT).

“We are proud to now be able to offer Information Technology degrees at all levels, starting at a two-year associate degree and ending with a Ph.D.,” said Dr. Donnie Grimes, Chair of the School of Computer and Information Sciences and Vice President for Information Services. “These programs will help the University prepare its students for the thousands of unfilled technology positions around the country.”

While the MSDF track will primarily feature the information security challenges that pertain to mitigating the risk of loss or the disclosure of data, the MSIT and Ph.D. IT programs will both explore the advanced role of IT in predicative analytics, identifying cyber threats, empowering data-driven policy changes, and more. The Ph.D. IT program will also include a dissertation and an emphasis on leadership.

All three programs will be offered online or in a hybrid program that has a required residency session each semester. The courses are all asynchronous,

featuring the offerings of a traditional classroom environment, to deliver an engaging, exceptional online education that fits the needs of students’ schedules.

“Since we understand that most adults need to provide for their families, we feel that offering these programs in a convenient online format is critical,” Grimes said. “The coursework has been designed to be rigorous, but the delivery method and support systems will provide the greatest probability of success for a full-time professional.”

Faculty in the School of Computer and Information Sciences live and work throughout the nation and are active members of the IT industry, staying up-to-date on the latest trends and resources. Graduates of the School have gone on to work for companies such as Google, IBM, and more.

The National Security Agency and the Department of Homeland Security have designated the University of the Cumberland as a National Center of Academic Excellence in Cyber Defense Education (CAE-CDE). This certification comes from the National Centers of Academic Excellence in Cyber Defense Education, Ft Meade, MD.
